FROM THE PRESIDENT

In December last year I was invited to Chapman Primary School to meet Grade 5 students. The children had been engaged in a project about services for older people. You will remember that 1999 was the International Year of Older Persons. The childrens' teacher copied for me comments made by them about older people. I thought you would like to hear them. A summary of the outcomes of the most recent Committee meeting is as follows: Audrey Williams, our Treasurer, presented another positive report. During the month, income of \$2210.80 was realized, and we spent \$1843.00. Our current operational account balance is \$7877.80. Ray Murray reported that he is waiting for responses from twelve businesses in the region which sell wool products. They have been offered space (at a fee) to exhibit their goods at Woden Wool 2000 (our fetc) in early May. The Committee has agreed on the purchase of a new computer, scanner, printer and essential software. The purchase will be finalised early in March. More than 25 members indicated an interest in using the Internet - this will be considered by the

Committee in the near future.

Lyle Mark presented a report on the implications of the GST for the Club. It was decided that the Club would of necessity apply for an ABN number, but will not at this time join the GST scheme. This will mean that we will need to raise another \$600-\$700 per year as sales tax exemption will no longer be available to us. We believe that this can be accomplished comfortably. It should be noted that if we elected to join the scheme it would mean an increase in membership fees. This not on the Committee's agenda.

I know how sad members have been at the passing away of two special members, Elsie Willoughby and Jack Roberts. Our thoughts are with Elsie's family and friends, and with Cynthia and her family.

Finally, it won't be long before our special event, Woden Wool 2000.In fact as I write this it is only 74 days away!
